THE IMPACT OF KAPPA SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships help Kappas reach their educational goals. With your support, you're empowering them as they strive to create meaningful change in the world.

Most merit-based scholarships are \$3,000 and most need-based scholarships are \$5,000. The Marisol scholarship is a need-based scholarship that provides three-quarters of educational costs, including tuition and fees, housing, and books.

In 2020–21, you helped provide: \$634,700 for 117 need-based scholarships \$853,000 for 293 merit scholarships \$302,500 for 100 graduate scholarships TOTAL \$1,790,200 for 510 scholarships

This scholarship alleviated all of the financial pressures of my senior year at William & Mary. For the first time since beginning college, I didn't have to take out any loans, which reduced my repayment burden by tens of thousands of dollars. For the first time in my life, the money I gained from working went into savings for my long-term goals instead of toward bills that drained my bank account the day after the deposit hit.

a work of heart

As a first-generation, full-time student paying her own way through nursing school, Sara Brummett, *Kentucky*, knows the challenge of juggling school and a job in order to cover her educational costs.

"That's why I'm forever grateful to have received a need-based scholarship," says Sara. "This scholarship will help pay for so many educational expenses such as my tuition and books."

In fall 2021, she'll complete her third semester of nursing school while she works as a patient care assistant at Norton Children's in her hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. "I've known that I wanted to be a nurse since I was in fourth grade — specifically a pediatric nurse," she says.

After she graduates in May 2022, Sara's goal is to start working as a registered nurse at Norton Children's. The hospital holds a special place in her heart: It's where she was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.

"Because of this scholarship, I'm able to continue studying nursing and make my dreams of being a pediatric nurse come true," Sara says. "There are not enough words to express how grateful I am for this scholarship. Thank you so much for contributing to my future."

The new year started off with so much promise. I had just finished an incredible year professionally, I had signed up to run two half marathons in 2020 and my young family had our first family vacation.

Everything changed in March 2020.

As I was training for my first half marathon of the year, I noticed a lump while putting on my sports bra. By the end of the month, I was diagnosed with breast cancer. So, amid the scariness of a pandemic and facing financial stress, I was also beginning my fight against breast cancer. To top it off, in April — just days after my first chemo treatment — my husband asked for a divorce.

As my family's financial situation continued to unravel, and medical expenses piled up, I learned about crushing amounts of debt my husband had incurred without my knowledge. I didn't know how I would pay my mortgage, medical expenses, daycare expenses and more.



Then, I remembered the many stories I had read over the years about how the Kappa Foundation helps members in need. In fall 2020, I reached out for help. And thanks to the Foundation, I was able to make ends meet during one of the darkest times of my life.

I'm forever grateful for the help of the Foundation and the generosity of members who took care of me when I needed it most.

After receiving her MCAT score, Elena remembers the immense gratitude she felt for the Foundation and the alumna network that always supported her educational endeavors.

She applied for and received a second grant to help her pay for the additional prerequisite classes for medical school admission. "I want to thank the Kappa Foundation and all of their donors for their generosity in supporting me to pursue my dream of becoming a physician," Elena says.

Ready for her next adventure, Elena is packing her bags and moving to New York City, where she'll be working in health care sales and recruiting at the Execu|Search Group as she applies for medical school.







endowment management

Kappa's Finance Committee and Investment Sub-Committee review our professional financial consultants regularly to ensure Kappa is receiving the best service from all providers. As a result of our recent review, we shifted our investment manager to Mercer Advisors. We made this change based on numerous factors, including Mercer's investment management abilities; experience with responsible, environmental, social and governance investing; focus on gender diversity within the firm; the broad selection of investment choices; performance reporting and client service model; and fees.

Kappa's first objective is to protect the assets that so many donors have given and second, to grow those assets over time. We use a variety of investment strategies to achieve those objectives and our Finance Committee, which is made up of Kappa volunteers that are experts in the space, monitors the portfolio quarterly.

As of June 30, 2021, the Kappa Foundation endowment was **\$59,943,660** with **125** endowed funds. Endowed gifts make a transformational impact in Kappa's programs and the lives of women. These funds may be established with a minimum **\$75,000** investment over five years.
